WM. G. BROWNLOW, Governor and Commander in Chief of Tennessee State Forces:

GOVERNOR—In obedience to an act passed in both Houses of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee, I have the honor to submit the following Report of the Regiments from this State, in the United States Army, for the years 1861-'62-'63-'64 and '65.

### REPORT.

The late gigantic war for universal freedom, and the establishment of the great principles of a republican form of government was commenced, finding the Volunteer State completely manacled by Isham G. Harris and the traitorous members of the Legislature of 1861. Unlike her sister States of this great Republic, her volnnteers were not induced to enter her service by enticing State bounties or pensions, but were compelled to escape the rebel videttes by way of the cold and desolate peaks of the Cumberland; and to-day she can with pride count her thirty thousand who enlisted in the grand army of the Republic under such trying circumstances. She has to mourn her thousands, who failed to make their escape, and perished in Southern prison pens. Thousands went to Kentucky, and enlisted in Kentucky regiments, before the organization of Tennessee regiments was commenced, and even after, being compelled to do so for want of necessary clothing and provisions. Mahy also enlisted in Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois regiments, of whom it is impossible to give any official account. Owing to the irregular manner in which Tennessee regiments were recruited and organized, it is impossible to give as complete and correct a history as is desirable. Yet no pains have been spared to accomplish that end. On entering upon my duties as Adjutant General, in March, 1865, I found the office almost destitute of the requisite information with which to make a correct report, although my predecessor, Major-General Gillem, and Colonel E. S. Richards, had used every endeavor to obtain the necessary information, during their term of office. All the regiments were

in active field service, and although requests were frequently forwarded for a synopsis of a history of each regiment, battallion, battery, and company, yet they were seldom complied with, as some of the regiments, especially the cavalry, were almost constantly on the march. Since the cessation of hostilities, I have used every exertion to obtain information, and to that end I issued the following circular, which was forwarded to every commanding officer whose address I could learn:

As many troops are being daily mustered out of the service, I desire to impress upon commanders of Tennessee regiments the necessity of promptitude in forwarding to this office all regimental records, books, papers, banners, trophies (with name of captors thereon), and, in fine, every thing that may be of aid in perpetuating the name and honorable record of the military organization of this State.

This is no common demand, and it is hoped that strenuous efforts will be made to collect and forward all such, the sight and mention of which, years hence, will swell the hearts of not only her sons and daughters, but all interested in the welfare of the Volunteer State.

Up to the present time, owing to our own beautiful State having been a part of the late scene of strife, it has been impracticable to secure such relics of valor as could have been desired; but now that peace and harmony is again established, and it is expected that all will soon return to their respective homes, let posterity know of you before disorganizing.

Circular, ) No. 3. ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE. Nashville, October 6, 1865.

SIR-As I propose making for publication a report of the Military status of Tennessee, past and present, and in order that the organization which you formerly commanded may be represented in an honorable light, I desire that you make, and forward with as little delay as practicable, a short Military History thereof.

In many instances the regimental and company records and colors have, instead of being turned over to the mustering officer, been retained, and are still in the possession of commanding officers. Should you have any such, you will please forward them to this

office immediately, via Express.

Many commendable acts of organizations and individuals have been noticed by orders and circulars from Commanding Generals; any such that you may have in your possession, or be cognizant of, will, if made known to this office, in said report, appear creditably to those concerned.

To avoid delay in compiling said report, I beg leave to again call your attention to the necessity of promptitude in complying with above.

In reply to these circulars, I received from several officers reports of the service rendered by their respective commands, while others did not reply, which fact will account for some regiments having a more complete history than others.

Many men were enlisted at Cumberland Gap, in the first, second, third, fifth, and sixth infantry, and in the first and second cavalry, in the year 1862, General G. W Morgan commanding, who died or were captured on Morgan's celebrated retreat to the Ohio River, who, I am sorry to inform you, are not accounted for on the muster rolls of their commands; which renders it very difficult for their bounty, pay and pension to be collected, and also reduces the number of troops, with which Tennessee should be credited. And I take this method of informing all concerned, that bounty, pay, and pension, in such cases, can be collected, by making out proper claims, with the affidavits of the officers in command at the time of the capture or the death of the soldier. This was the case of the ill-fated Thirteenth Tennessee Cavalry, nearly all of whom were massacred at Fort Pillow, by Forrest's command; and I regret exceedingly that it is not in my power.

#### TREASONABLE CONDUCT OF GOVERNOR HARRIS.

The call of the late lamented President Lincoln upon this State for volunteers to aid in quelling the rebellion, was answered by an insolent and treasonable refusal from Governor Harris to discharge a duty which his obligation as a citizen and his oath of office both bound him to perform. This occurred in April, 1861. The State was at once the theatre of

fierce excitement. A mock election was held after the State had been transferred to the Richmond Junto by secret treaty, and Tennessee was officially declared to be a member of the Southern Confederacy. Had a patriot at that time been at the helm of our State, the appalling shipwreck which she suffered would have been avoided. To the great injury and reproach of the people, their Executive was a man false to every principle of private and public honor, untrue to every trust as a citizen and an officer; with morals so perverted that he studiously preferred to do wrong, even when it was easier to do right; a libertine in private life, a robber of the public funds, a preacher of sedition, a perjurer who violated every obligation and broke every oath, a conspirator who for his own advantage sacrificed the fortunes and the lives of thousands whose confidence he had won. A career so devoid of virtue and honor fitly terminated in disgrace, for at the first approach of the army of that country which he had insulted and deserted, Governor Harris fled with precipitation, leaving his victims to the mercy of a foe whom he had not the courage to face.

The resolution, as passed by the General Assembly, requires the Adjutant General to furnish a roster of the colored troops from this State. I regret very much that it is impossible to comply with the requisition. It would be but simple justice to the colored soldier, who with undaunted courage faced the deadly missiles of the traitorous foe, and assisted in defending the State Capital against the enemies of freedom, to place his name on the Roll of Honor; but this is impossible. The colored troops were enlisted as United States Colored Infantry, and were not credited to the State. The rolls of the different regiments were never forwarded to this office, but sent to the Adjutant General's Office at Washington City, where they properly belong.

This Report shows the following number of troops raised in Tennessee for the United States Service, viz:

Eight Infantry Regiments.

Eight Mounted Infantry Regiments.

Twelve Cavalry Regiments.

Five Batteries of Light Artillery.

In addition to the above troops, there were enlisted in this State by United States recruiting officers, 17,770 colored troops, which were not reported to this office, and are not included, accordingly, in this record.

From various sources, believed to be perfectly reliable, it is estimated, also, that some 7,000 Tennesseeans enlisted in the Kentucky Federal Regiments, and were credited to that State.
